HISTORY OF TOWER HILL BOTANIC GARDEN

TIMELINE

1842	March 3, Worcester County Horticultural Society incorporated
1846	Society receives its first bequest, \$3,000, from Daniel Waldo
1851	1st Horticultural Hall built at 16-20 Front Street, Worcester
1853	Because of their popularity, fruit, flower and vegetable exhibitions begin to be held weekly from May through August
1861	All exhibitions canceled due to poor growing season (first & only time)
1867	Exhibitions outgrow Horticultural Hall and larger ones held in Mechanics Hall
1874	First Spring Flower Show held
1875	Membership nears 1400; WCHS is debt-free and leases first floor of Horticulture Hall for steady income
1876	WCHS sends representatives to the Centennial Int'l Exhibition in Philadelphia to exhibit prize-winning fruit
1892	50th WCHS anniversary celebration held in spite of blizzard
1906	First Children's exhibitions held
1917	WCHS sponsors program of Victory Gardening during World War I including lectures on the best way to grow vegetables
1924	Horticultural Hall leased to F.W. Woolworth for 50 years; WCHS purchases the home of Harry W. Smith to build a larger WCHS building
1928	New Horticultural Building opens at 30 Elm Street, Worcester
1942	100th WCHS anniversary celebrated; party briefly interrupted by WWII air raid siren requiring move to bomb shelter
1952	WCHS begins support of Experimental Orchard of Old Apple Varieties on S. Lothrop Davenport's farm; orchard move to Old Sturbridge Village in 1973 and to THBG in 1990
1983	Trustees vote to establish a Botanic Garden
1986	Tower Hill Botanic Garden officially opens in Boylston, MA
1988	Initial 50 year Master Plan for Tower Hill unveiled and approved
1990	Lawn Garden, Secret Garden and Harrington Orchard dedicated
1991	Over 15,000 attend the last WCHS Spring Flower Show at Worcester Centrum
1992	WCHS celebrates its 150th Anniversary with party at Mechanics Hall
1992	Fuller Drive opens creating new entrance at 11 French Drive
1994	Stoddard Education and Visitors Center opens
1997	The Cary Award, recognizing distinctive plants for New England, introduced
1999	The Orangerie, Tower Hill's temperate conservatory, opens
2000	The Systematic Garden opens
2001	The Folly constructed in the Inner Park
2002	The Hope H. Spear Wildlife Refuge Pond completed
2002	The Temple of Peace opens in the Inner Park
2010	The Winter Garden and Limonaia open
2015	The Court: A Garden Within Reach, an accessible garden, opens
2016	A new Master Plan is approved by the Board of Trustees
2016	The Worcester Tree Initiative becomes an independent program of THBG
2016	THBG celebrates its 30th anniversary, and recognizes the WCHS 175th anniversary with a Gala held in the fall
