

# Bumblebee

Short, open flowers with lots of nectar and cold-colored petals

# Honeybee

Tubular flowers that are blue, purple, or pink

# Hummingbird

Warm-colored or purple flowers that have long tubular flowers

# Butterfly

Warm-colored flowers that are flat-topped or clustered

# Hoverfly

Pale- or dull-colored flowers that smell like rotting meat

# Wasp

White or yellow flowers that have easily accessible nectar



# Bat

White or pale-colored flowers with strong fragrances and large petals

# Beetle

White- or yellow-colored flowers that are either bowl shaped or clustered together

# Moth

White or pale-colored flowers that are clustered together. Has ample nectar

# Ant

Small, odd-looking flowers that are found low to the ground



# New Mexican Larkspur

Best for a pollinator that can see this light purple in the dark.

# Queen of the Night

Best for a pollinator that can see in the dark and has a good sense of smell.

# Zinnia

Best for a pollinator who needs a landing platform and likes warm colors.

# Trumpet Vine

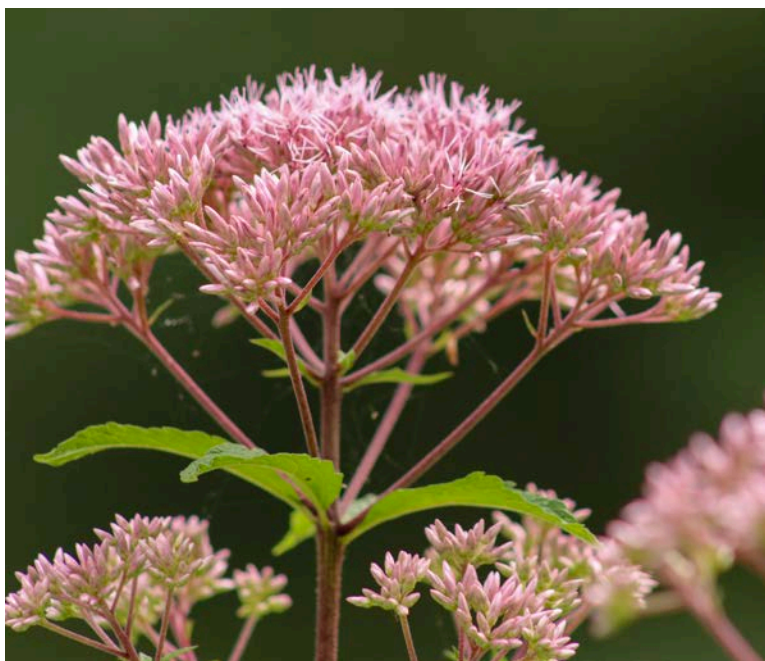
Best for a pollinator that can reach the nectar at the end of the flower tube.

# Skunk Cabbage

Best for a pollinator that likes the smell of rotting meat.

# Goldenrod

Best for a pollinator that can sit on the clustered flowers and eat a lot of pollen.



## **Queen Anne's Lace**

Best for a pollinator that enjoys easy-to-reach nectar.

## **Hearts-a- bursting**

Best for a pollinator that is found low to the ground.

## **Lavender**

Best for a pollinator that sees the color purple well and enjoys a nectar reward.

## **Joe-Pye Weed**

Best for a pollinator that see cool colors and can easily drink nectar from a short, tubular flower.
