# **Night Lights at New England Botanic Garden illuminates the winter season with its most dazzling spectacle yet**

***Over 1,000 visitors experience the magic of Night Lights on opening weekend***

**BOYLSTON, MA, November 25, 2025** – New England Botanic Garden’s highly anticipated annual winter light display, [Night Lights](#), opened Saturday, kicking off a season of illumination at the Boylston-based botanic garden. More than one thousand people visited over the weekend to take in the Garden’s signature event, this year nominated for [USA Today’s Best Botanical Garden Holiday Lists](#) list. The dazzling spectacle features more garden spaces than ever, half a million lights, and festive activities for all ages. Visitors can experience Night Lights through January 4, 2026.

As Night Lights continues, visitors can expect to be immersed in displays that celebrate nature and highlight the unique beauty of the botanic garden from stunning plant collections to dramatic architecture, and enchanting landscapes. Created in-house by a talented and creative team of staff, Night Lights displays change each year, so there is always something new and exciting for returning visitors to discover. This year’s displays, designed around the theme “Dazzling Gardens,” include an illuminated forest of tree forms, a festive fir bedecked in birdhouses, “glitter critters,” and more. Iconic features, including a 100-foot rainbow tunnel, a nostalgic model train display, and a towering tree constructed from living bromeliad plants, return to make the event magical.

In addition to the lights, visitors can enjoy an exciting lineup of festive activities at Night Lights. Roasting s’mores over fire pits, holiday shopping, and taking fun photos with family and friends, are a few. For those who are hungry, dinner with a cup of mulled wine from the onsite café, the Farmer and the Fork, while taking in the lights, will also be an experience to remember.

“We’re excited to light up the darkest months of the year with Night Lights. This event is all about celebrating the season and discovering joy both in nature and in a sense of community,” says Grace Elton, New England Botanic Garden CEO. “In addition to introducing many first-time visitors to the botanic garden, Night Lights also helps fund the Garden’s mission of connecting people and plants all year long, so we couldn’t be more grateful for the support of our visitors.”

### **Night Lights Food Drive**

New to Night Lights this year, the Garden is partnering with the Boylston Food Pantry to host a food drive during the event. Visitors can support individuals and families from the local community by bringing a nonperishable food item to donate on any visit.

### **Discounts, Flex Passes, Value Hours, and Free Parking**

Garden members receive a 25 percent discount on tickets and 50 percent off on tickets purchased for the evenings of December 1, 2, and 3 (while supplies last!). New this year, visitors looking for the flexibility to attend Night Lights any evening without making an advanced registration can purchase a Glow Together Flex Pass. This flat-rate, single use pass can be used any evening, including nights that are sold out. Also new, visitors purchasing tickets for standard rate evenings can enjoy a 20 percent discount on tickets selected for 8 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. timeslots. This Value Hours discount is available to Garden members and non-members. Card to Culture Discounts are also available, and free onsite parking is offered to all every evening.

### **Ticket Information**
