Larger-than-life pollinators soar in new exhibition at New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill Experience *Glass in Flight* Now Through November 1

BOYLSTON, MA, May 18, 2026 – [New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill](#) has exciting new sculpture exhibition now on view at their Boylston-based garden. [Glass in Flight](#) by Alex Heveri features 30 large-scale sculptures that bring to life pollinators and other beneficial insects through *Dalle de Verre* stained glass and steel. Visitors to the Garden will encounter hummingbirds, butterflies, dragonflies, beetles, and more as they shimmer in the sunlight, soar overhead, pose in midair, or hide among the blooms. Blending brilliant color, light, and scale, *Glass in Flight* celebrates these charismatic creatures and their environmental significance. *Glass in Flight* has been featured at major botanic gardens across the U.S., but its appearance at New England Botanic Garden marks its regional debut and includes several never-before-seen sculptures.

“With *Glass in Flight*, I hope to create moments of surprise and delight within the Garden’s landscape. My sculptures are meant to enhance the experience of walking through nature—to celebrate color, light, and the essential role pollinators play in the world around us,” Heveri says.

Based in Tucson, Arizona, [Alex Heveri](#) is a nationally recognized glass and steel sculptor and a full-time defense attorney. For more than 30 years, she has transformed public and private spaces with her bold, luminous sculptures. Heveri’s signature stained-glass technique, *Dalle de Verre*, is a French method involving thick slabs of colored glass cut and shaped into bold designs and set into place with epoxy. This creates a textured surface that comes alive in natural light, shifting and glowing as the sun moves across the sky. Over the past five years, Heveri has created more than 150 monumental steel-and-glass sculptures, some soaring over 14 feet tall. Each work is conceived, designed, cut, assembled, and welded entirely by Heveri in her Tucson home studio.

“Working with Alex Heveri has been an inspiration,” says Lea Morgan, exhibitions manager for New England Botanic Garden. “Her sculptures invite a sense of wonder, awe, and curiosity about the natural world that perfectly aligns with the Garden’s mission and the experiences we aim to foster year-round. We hope our visitors will enjoy encountering these captivating, iconic pieces, and return throughout the seasons to experience them again in a new light.”

While *Glass in Flight* is on display, the Garden will offer guided walking tours of the exhibition, as well as golf cart tours designed for visitors with limited mobility. These tours are included with general admission, but advanced registration is recommended. On Wednesdays and Thursdays during June, July, and August, visitors can also experience the magic of *Glass in Flight* during golden hour, as the Garden stays open late for [Extended Summer Evening](#) programming.
